8.5 Temporary Borrowing Resolution

WHEREAS Section 66 of the Municipal Government Act provides that the Council of the Town of Trenton, subject to the approval of the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, may borrow to expend funds for a capital purpose as authorized by statute;

WHEREAS the Council of the Town of Trenton has adopted a capital budget for this fiscal year as required by Section 65 of the Municipal Government Act and are so authorized to expend funds for capital purposes as identified in their capital budget; and

WHEREAS the specific amounts and descriptions of the projects are contained in Schedule "A" (attached);

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED

THAT under the authority of Section 66 of the Municipal Government Act, the Council of the Town of Trenton borrow a sum or sums not exceeding Four Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$ 450,000) for the purpose set out above, subject to the approval of the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing;

THAT the sum be borrowed by the issue and sale of debentures of the Council of the Town of Trenton to such an amount as the Council deems necessary;

THAT the issue of debentures be postponed pursuant to Section 92 of the Municipal Government Act and that a sum or sums not exceeding Four Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$450,000) in total be borrowed from time to time from any chartered bank or trust company doing business in Nova Scotia;

THAT the sum be borrowed for a period not exceeding Twelve (12) Months from the date of approval of the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing of this resolution;

THAT the interest payable on the borrowing be paid at a rate to be agreed upon; and

THAT the amount borrowed be repaid from the proceeds of the debentures when sold.

- Kudos to the rink staff for great maintenance and service during a recent tournament.

Councillor Cullen:

- The Forge Society is up and running, with the aim to raise funds for Parks and Recreation equipment and facilities, as well Town beautification. The next meeting will be held on February 18 at 6:00 pm.

Councillor LeBlanc:

- A Revenue Committee has been struck to examine fundraising options for libraries.
- The Grade 8 Trip is on for this year.
- Welcome to the Burger Jerk restaurant.

Councillor MacKinnon:

- Thank you to everyone who shoveled out fire hydrants in the community.
- The ballpark has been plowed for walking.
- Snowshoes and headlamps are available to borrow from the Town.
