

BYLAWS MADE PURSUANT TO SECTION 8 OF AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE TRUSTEES OF THE TRENTON PARKS BEING CHAPTER 90 OF THE STATUTES OF NOVA SCOTIA, 1964

Definitions:

1. In these by laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the expression:
 - a. "Park" means Steeltown Centennial Park in the Town of Trenton.
 - b. "Corporation" means the Trustees of the Trenton Parks as created under An Act to Incorporate the Trustees of the Trenton Parks.

Closing of Park:

2.
 - a. No person, except an employee of the Town or Commission or a registered camper, shall enter or be in the park between the hours of 10:00 o'clock in the afternoon and 7:00 o'clock in the forenoon unless expressly authorized by the Corporation or its designated representative.
 - b. The Corporation whenever it deems necessary for the protection of the forests within the Park may at any time by proclamation set aside for any period deemed necessary any areas of such forest land upon which no person shall enter for the purpose of traveling camping, setting fires, or picnicking, or any other purpose without first notifying the corporation, or its designated representative, and having obtained authorization from such person so authorized to issue same.
 - c. When the Corporation makes a proclamation pursuant to sub section (b) no person shall violate such proclamation without proper authorization.

Travel within Park:

3.
 - a. No person shall drive an automobile, bicycle, motorcycle, snowmobile, or any other vehicle upon any of the roads within the confines of the Park at a rate of speed exceeding 25 kilometres per hour and no person shall ride a bicycle, horse or motorcycle, or drive an automobile or snowmobile upon any of the footpaths within the confines of the Park.
 - b. All roadways within the Park shall be closed to motor vehicles, except those authorized by the Corporation or its designated representative, from the 30th day of October of each year to the 1st day of June in the following year.
 - c. No vehicles except for those of registered campers, and other specifically authorized by the corporation, shall be permitted entrance to the park when concerts or other entertainment is schedules for the amphitheater. During these periods, all vehicles will be required to park in the lot located next to the Community Rink.

Firearms:

4.
 - a. No person shall discharge firearms, air guns or use bows and arrows or slingshots or other dangerous weapons within the Park except that bows and arrows may be used by authorized persons in the area designated for the use of the Steeltown Archery Club.

Wildlife:

5.
 - a. No person shall hunt, chase, kill, tease, annoy or otherwise disturb any bird or animal within the park.

b. Fishing is permitted within the Park subject to the licensing requirements and regulations of the Province of Nova Scotia

c. The Corporation, whenever it deems it necessary for the protection of the lakes, may at any time by proclamation prohibit fishing within the confines of the Park.

d. No owner of a dog shall permit the dog to run at large at any time within the Park and any person harboring or claiming to be the owner of such dog shall be deemed to be the owner.

Damage to Trees, Shrubs Etc.

6. a. No person shall remove earth, sods or stones, from the park or cut down or take away or injure any of the trees, shrubs, bushes or plants growing therein or erect any booth, tent or shed, or park a trailer anywhere in the Park without having received the permission of the Corporation in writing.

b. No person shall injure or deface any of the buildings, structures, fences, signs, seats, benches or ornaments of any kind, or in any way foul or pollute any fountain, stream, pool well or spring within the park.

Rubbish:

7. a. No one shall deposit rubbish or other articles on any part of the Park.

Fire Protection:

8. a. No person shall make, light or start or cause to be made, lighted or started any fire on any land within the Park without the permission of the Corporation.

b. Registered campers may, unless otherwise posted, make a fire within his/her campsite, for the purpose of cooking or obtaining warmth provided extreme care is taken to prevent such fire from spreading.

c. No person shall leave any fire which has been made, lighted or started without first extinguishing the fire completely.

Swimming, Skating:

9. a. Persons using the lakes, ponds, streams, etc. for swimming or skating do so at their own risk.

Penalty:

10. a. Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provisions of these bylaws shall for each offense be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty dollars (\$50.00) and in default of payment, to imprisonment for a period not exceeding ten (10) days.
