

NO. 21 JUKEBOX

1. In this by-law,

“person” shall mean the proprietor, manager, or person apparently having the charge or control of any premises and includes any individual, firm or corporation.

“premises” shall mean any store, restaurant, place of business, or place to which the public are permitted to have access.

2. No person shall have, or permit the operation of, any automatic machine for producing music of the type known as a “juke box” in any premises within the Town of Trenton unless an unexpired license in respect of such machine has been issued as herein provided.

3. Such license shall be issued by the Town Clerk and the fee therefor shall be \$50.00 per year. Every such license shall expire on the 31st day of December in the year in which the same was issued, provided that where such license is issued at a time less than twelve months from the date of expiry, a pro rata license fee may be charged.

4. Such license may be in the following form:

5. Notwithstanding the issue of any such license, no person shall permit the operation of any automatic machine for producing music of the type known as a “juke box” in any premises within the Town of Trenton at any time after the hour of eleven P.M. in any day and before the hour of eight A.M. on the morning of the day next following.

6. Notwithstanding the issue of any such license, no person shall permit the operation of any automatic machine for producing music of the type known as a “juke box” in any premises within the Town of Trenton on the first day of the week commonly known as Sunday.

7. Any person violating this by-law shall for each such offense be liable to penalty not exceeding One Hundred Dollars and in default of payment thereof to imprisonment for a period not exceeding two months.

8. Every day which such violation continues shall be deemed a fresh offence.
