Municipal Election 2024

Town of Trenton residents, like all Nova Scotians, will choose their Municipal representatives on October 19, 2024. In addition to choosing a Mayor for the Town, voters will elect four (4) Councillors, each elected for a four-year term. Trenton voters elect the Mayor and Councillors, while the Deputy Mayor is selected and appointed through a Council motion annually. Councillors do not represent a specific district or ward, but rather each serves the Town as a whole.

If you are considering running in the municipal election, we recommend that you start by reading the Candidate's Guide to Municipal & School Board Elections to learn general information, key dates, and more. This guide can be found on the Town's website at www.trenton.ca and on the Elections Pictou County website. The final day to register to become a candidate is **September 10, 2024**.

The Returning Office which will manage the elections for the 6 municipalities in Pictou County is now open. If you are interested in running for office, contact:

Municipal Property Tax Exemption

Applications for the Town's Property Tax Exemption for the 2024-2025 fiscal year are now available at the Town Office (120 Main St.) and online at www.trenton.ca. This exemption is available to any person assessed to a taxable property in the Town of Trenton; currently lives in the home; and whose total income from all sources for the 2023 year was less than \$28,797 (total income means total household income excluding war veteran's allowance or pension paid pursuant to the Pension Act). Applicants must provide proof of income and the application signature must be witnessed at Town Hall. The maximum exemption is \$274. All applications must be returned to Town Hall no later than August 30, 2024.

2024 Paving Schedule

S.W. Weeks Construction has been awarded the tender by the Town to carry out paving of the following sections of streets in 2024:

- Park Street from Duke Street to Bernard's Lane
- Ninth Street from Duke Street to Duchess Avenue
- Dickie Street from Mechanic Street to Grandview Avenue

Paving is expected to occur in August. Once the paving dates are scheduled, we will post the details on the Town's website (www.trenton.ca) & social media.

Removal of Dangerous / Obstructing Vegetation

Pursuant the Municipal Government Act, 1998, c.18, s. 321., the Town has the authority to require an owner or occupant of land adjoining a street to remove or trim a tree, bush, shrub, hedge, or other vegetation that is a source of danger to traffic on the street. Vegetation on private land should not obstruct pedestrians use of sidewalks or reduce visibility on streets or at intersections including signage. This necessary property maintenance is not the responsibility of the Public Works Dept. If you are not physically capable of completing this work yourself, residents are encouraged to contact a local landscaping company to provide the service. Where the owner of the land fails to remove or trim the vegetation within fourteen (14) days after receipt of notice from the Town, the Town may cause the vegetation to be removed or trimmed. Any costs incurred in this manner will be the responsibility of the property owner.

THREE STEPS TO COST-EFFECTIVE

HOME HEAT PROTECTION

STEP 1: Plan ahead to keep cool

Do-it-vourself - \$0

- Help vulnerable neighbors, family, and friends be prepared, and arrange to check on them during heat events.
- Sign up for heat alerts on your phone (e.g., WeatherCan).
- Learn how to best use windows and doors to naturally ventilate your home, particularly at night.
- Choose energy efficient lights and appliances that produce less "waste" heat.
- Temporarily arrange to work or sleep in cooler rooms (e.g., basement).

STEP 2: Complete simple upgrades

Do-it-yourself - Under \$250 (estimate)

- Plant & maintain shade trees, especially along south, east & west facing walls.
- Grow plants climbing up your walls and on decks and balconies.
- Improve home insulation and air tightness (e.g., draft strips).
- Install blinds, heat-resistant curtains, or films on windows.
- Use portable or ceiling fans that increase air circulation.

STEP 3: Complete more complex upgrades

Work with a contractor - Over \$250

- Convert paved areas to vegetation which absorbs less heat and more water.
- Install a green (vegetated) or reflective roof.
- Shade windows with outdoor shutters and awnings.
- Install windows and doors that have a low Solar Heat Gain Coefficient (let less heat in).
- Install and maintain a heat pump or air conditioning unit.

Protect Yourself from Heat-related Illness

We have experienced high heat and humidity this summer, which can put you at risk for heat-related illnesses, especially if you're working or exercising outside. It's harder for our bodies to maintain a healthy internal temperature when it's hot and humid. Our bodies usually cool down by sweating, but sweating is less effective when it's humid. Some people, like infants and young children, seniors, and people with chronic medical conditions, have a higher risk for developing heat-related illnesses.

Preventing heat-related illnesses:

- drinking plenty of water
- staying in shaded or cool areas
- taking frequent breaks if you have to work outside
- wearing lightweight, light-coloured clothing
- never leave children, infants or pets unattended in vehicles
- check on older neighbours and others vulnerable to heat-related illness, offer air-conditioned shelter and water if needed
