 - Protective Services (Fire & Police – legislated, offsets operating & some capital costs)
 - Town staff wages as well as stipends for elected officials
 - Regional Emergency Management contributions
 - Regional Partnerships (tourism, transit, health initiatives, etc.)
 - Curbside Solid Waste collection (Pictou County Solid Waste)
 - Recreation programs & facilities
 - Property Valuation Services (legislated)
 - Capital improvements or programs (includes equipment purchases)
 - Other operational costs
- (the Town cannot legally budget or "plan" for an Operating deficit)
