Businesses can apply on the PCREN website - pictoucounty.com/advisorprogram/ Applications will be reviewed by PCREN staff. There are a limited number of spots available in the program, so businesses are encouraged to apply before July 15th. If accepted, businesses will be matched with a Virtual Adviser from a network of thousands of professionals based on the business need or challenge. On a mutually agreed schedule, the businesses will meet virtually with their business adviser to discuss the challenges and find potential solutions.
